The H.O.M.E. Act

Source of Income (SOI)

The income must be verifiable, regular, and legal. Some examples include:

- Employment wages
- Social Security benefits
- Retirement income
- Child support and/or alimony
- Housing Choice Voucher

Housing Choice Vouchers

Vouchers are a form of housing assistance issued by HUD to eligible low-income individuals and families.

Landlords must comply with Federal, State, and Local fair housing laws and cannot discriminate against voucher holders.

Voucher holders must pay 30-40% of their income on rent.

SOI Discrimination

The Fair Housing Act defines discrimination broadly as any attempt to prohibit or limit free and fair housing choice based on membership in a protected class. By refusing to accept Housing Choice Vouchers or creating additional barriers for voucher holders, landlords limit access to housing. Some examples inlude:

- Advertising that includes "no vouchers/ Section 8" or other language that implies the landlord will not accept vouchers.
- Using a separate application process for voucher holders
- Not including the voucher amount so the tenant can't qualify under the income qualifications
- Requiring voucher holders to move in on the 1st of the month
- Intentionally pricing a unit beyond what a voucher would cover

In 2020, Maryland passed the Housing Opportunities Made Equal Act, which adds Source of Income to the list of protected classes in Maryland.
